The 2021-2022 year was no exception. In September, we collected \$370.00 for the recently revised Bright Beginnings Pre-School in the Bethesda United Presbyterian Church in Elizabeth. At the October meeting, \$350.00 was collected for the Schools of Africa/Jubulani School Project. In November, \$415.00 was donated to the Olivet Presbyterian Church in West Elizabeth. Louise Biddle, one of our members, was a faithful volunteer of this food bank for several years.

At the March meeting, \$405.00 was donated as well as many items of clothing for newborn babies to Betty Jane Berich's project, "Baby Love Layettes". In April, \$335.00 was collected for the St. Matthew's Episcopal Church Food Bank of Homestead. Lillian Lutz and Jan Kusserow are members

of this church.

In addition, \$533.00 was collected at the May meeting for Grant-in-Aid that was deposited in July for the current 2022-2023 year.

The Nancy Grove Visionary Fund awards a grant to in-service active teacher members to fund innovative ideas and activities related to Excellence in Education within the educational community. (February 1)

Enrichment Grants will be awarded to active members for three years in good standing who wish to enroll in an Elderhostel Program, continuing education for personal and professional growth, a travel/study tour, or to develop an approved independent study project, or to present a paper to a professional organization. (February 1)

Scholarships will be offered to active members in good standing for three years who are taking graduate study for credit leading to an advanced degree, certification or toward job/self-improvement. (February 1)

The Album of Distinction (AOD) award is given to recognize a member who has already received an honor or distinction beyond DKG. (March 1)

The Achievement Award is to honor a member's Delta Kappa Gamma leadership. (March 15)

DKG RESOURCES AT YOUR FINGERTIPS ON THE WEBSITES

As members of DKG, there is a wealth of information available to you via our chapter, the state, and the International websites. Here is an overview of what awaits you on each site.

CHAPTER SITE (alphaphipa.weebly.com)

We have six sections to our site (along with our home page):

- Home page on which you can find an inspirational quote posted weekly directly under the
 featured picture as well as a general welcome to the chapter. This is the page you first see
 when going to the website.
- About us which features a drop-down menu with choices of officers, mission and purposes, committees, rules, history, calendar, and news. The news section features highlights from the chapter meetings and special activities.
- Communication where we post our newsletters.
- **Community Outreach** which also has a drop-down menu with choices of projects (features descriptions and pictures of our charities) and Grant-in-Aid.
- **Resources** also has a drop-down menu for our elevator speech, inspirational thoughts (from our chapter meetings), and links (to the state and International websites)
- **Contact us** is just that. It contains a form that one can fill out and submit. The form comes to the webmaster and depending on the nature of the information/question the form is then shared with the appropriate officer or chapter member.

 More has a drop-down menu with two items: conventions (articles and pictures from various DKG conferences and conventions) and archives (items from 2017-2018 are housed here; other years are at the end of the current year in Alpha Phi news (About Us section).

STATE SITE (dkgpa.weebly.com)

In addition to the home page, there are seven sections to the state site:

- Home page features a picture gallery and buttons (current edition of the Keystonian, Updates from President Eileen, and more) that take you directly to the listed item.
- **Home** with a drop-down menu with choices of current year directory, projects, state bylaws, and more.
- **Updates** containing dates of events or items due and containing President Eileen's letters to members.
- **Awards and Scholarships** with a drop-down menu linking one to information on the Album of Distinction, Nancy Grove Scholarship, Rosebud Award, and Scholarships and Grants.
- Chapters features a drop-down menu containing locate, newsletters, news, and websites.
- **Communication** also has a drop-down menu for the Keystonian online, Keystonian archives, DKG ap, and MYDKG set up.
- **2022 State Convention** whose drop-down menu leads you to the minutes from the event, reports, workshop handouts, and more.
- Archives has a drop-down menu for forms, site map, and biennium reports.

INTERNATIONAL SITE (dkg.org)

This site is being redesigned to become more user friendly and user focused and the new site is due to be rolled out at the end of 2022. It will have seven tabs for:

- About
- Publications/Documents
- Media Resources
- Events
- Leadership Lab
- DKGIEF
- MyDKG

There will also be a non-member site containing:

- About
- Membership
- Events
- Publications
- Leadership Lab
- Contact
- Donate

Until the change, the site contains:

- **Home Page** contains an information gallery, buttons that take one to information on the many opportunities within DKG, member spotlight, an online chat feature, and more. To get to specific information, one must sign in to the site (button on the top right). The sign in requires one's membership number and password; contact Donna Shultz for more information.
- **Events** has a drop-down menu for conventions, conferences, calendar, related events, Go Ahead tours, and the *centennial celebration* (in 2029, DKG will celebrate its 100th anniversary. Each year leading up to the centennial celebration will feature a video highlighting events of each decade of DKG).
- **Publications** links one to the Journal and the Collegial Bulletin.
- Programs/Projects drops down to Schools for Africa, Supporting Early Career Educators,
 Project Spotlight, Program Ideas for Chapters.
- About Us, through a drop-down menu, will take one to the Society's mission, vision, and purposes; benefits; discounts; insurance benefits; history; founders; administrative board; executive board; and, others.
- **Contact Us** has inquiry buttons (general, membership, DKGIEF, finance, publications, other) that when clicked on bring up a form one completes and sends on to International.
- DKGIEF's drop down lists various awards, funds, scholarships, World Fellowship, and a blog.
