She earned her Bachelor of Science degree from Mansfield University. She furthered her education by attaining a Master's Degree in Special Education from Duquesne University. Her passion for teaching led to a fulfilling 35-year career as a Home Economics teacher, beginning with Duquesne School District, later the Allegheny Intermediate Unit, and finally the most years at Peters Township School District, from where she retired in 2015. She was a dedicated public servant, serving on the Board of Jefferson Hills, as Vice President and Mayor. She had numerous accolades and awards for her service to her community and church. She was active in many professional organizations, and we were one of the last on her long list.

Donna was inducted into our chapter in September 1974, passing away just months from attaining 50 years of membership.
