Information on the U.S. Forum: Bills being followed by the Chapter

Despite the interest in preventing bulling in schools and the concern over spending government funds to teach divisive concepts, the two bills that we have been following all year have not been acted upon by the legislature.

These bills are:

H.R. 4402: Safe Schools Improvement Act of 2021

This bill was introduced on **July 9, 2021** by Linda Sanchez (D) Representative for California 38th Congressional District and 178 co-sponsors. It is in the first stage of the legislative process in the 117th session. This legislation has a long history. An earlier version (HR 3132 in the 110th session) was introduced on July 23, 2007. Similar bills were introduced on May 5, 2009 (H.R. 2262, 111th); April 15, 2011 (H.R.1648, 112th), May 14, 2013, (H.R. 1199, 113th), June 25, 2015 (H.R. 2902, 114th), April 5, 2017 (H.R. 1957, 115th), and May 9, 2017 (H.R. 2653, 116th).

Although educators recognize the harm that can be inflicted upon students when they are bullied by their peers, we have not been able to have the legislation to prevent bullying enacted.

S. 2682: PEACE Act

This bill was introduced on August 9, 2021 by Marco Rubio, (R) Senior Senator for Florida, and 2 co-sponsors. This legislation was designed to amend title III of division H of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 to prohibit the expenditure of federal funds to support the Department of Education's mandates related to the Proposed Priorities-American History and Civics Education.

There were no previous bills introduced related to this topic. Although some educators oppose being required to teach Critical Race Theory, they haven't been able to get their legislators to move this bill through the legislative process.


